Report Highlights Threat of Vouchers /Tax Credits to Public Education

With President Trump and Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos pushing for \$20 billion in federal funds to be used for block grants supporting school choice initiatives like vouchers, The Century Foundation, a public policy research institute founded in 1919, released a report that identified school vouchers and tax credits as a real threat to public education

In addition to redirecting funding away from public schools, TCF argues that vouchers also increase student segregation by race and socioeconomic status. Additionally, vouchers, which siphon taxpayer money to private schools, have shown to have a potentially negative impact on student achievement. The report supports socioeconomic integration programs in public school districts and the expansion of magnet programs that have been shown to expand student educational opportunities.

With the House Oversight Committee voting to approve the continuation of the D.C. Opportunity Scholarship Program, the only federally-funded
