Thousands of books were donated. We started with 271 banana boxes, about 10,000 books, on Friday morning. There were approximately 62 boxes remaining at the end of the sale. Various local agencies and Friends of the Standish Library received the left-over books.

Midland AAUW Public Policy Committee Report

This autumn is a busy time for the Midland AAUW Public Policy Committee and Midland League of Women Voters (LWV). The following is offered as information for the upcoming elections.

Michigan Ballot Proposals on Nov. 6 General Election

Proposal #2 creates an independent citizens' redistricting commission. This proposal will keep legislators from creating districts benefitting themselves (gerrymandering).

Proposal #3 adds eight voting policies to the Michigan Constitution, including straight-ticket voting, automatic voter registration, same-day voter registration and no-excuse absentee voting.

AAUW National, MI AAUW Board, and Midland AAUW Public Policy Committee endorse these proposals.

Local Action

In September, Midland AAUW and Midland LWV joined forces to organize the Midland Public School Board Election Forum which resulted in a successful debate by candidates for the School Board. Midland LWV held a General Election Candidate Forum on October 1. MCTV filmed the debates live for later viewing.

On October 16 at 7 pm, Midland LWV will hold a Candidate Forum for MI 98th District State House Representative featuring opposing candidates Sarah Schulz and Annette Glenn at the MCTV studio in the Grace A. Dow Memorial Library. It is important for everyone to come to the debate to learn candidates' views and show civic interest by attending. MCTV is filming the debate live for later viewing.

Other News

A poll conducted by EPIC-MRA, a survey research firm on public opinion, was released September 14, 2018. It found that "84% of active and likely November voters said they support new laws to provide women more tools to get fair pay in the workplace". Michigan women in the aggregate earn about 76 cents on the dollar that men earn. These poll results were shared with Michigan Equal Pay Coalition 9 in which MI AAUW and Midland AAUW participate along with American Civil Liberties Union of MI, Business and Professional Women-Michigan Federation, Zonta International District 15, League of Women Voters of Michigan and 16 more organizations. The poll results will be shared in 2018-2019 with the MI Legislature, outgoing and incoming, in the hopes of getting movement on long-stalled bills that will help women in Michigan close the wage gap.
