Carpenter Street](#). There are five candidates running for three open seats this year. The candidates are: Patrick Frazee (incumbent), Jon Lauderbach, Philip Rausch, Pam Singer (incumbent), and Kurt Yockey.

Local Candidate Forum Was Impressive

About 100 people attended a successful Candidate Forum on Women's Issues that was organized last July by the Branch Public Policy Committee. The event, held at Grace A. Dow Library, presented the opportunity for Republican and Democratic candidates to answer questions on women's issues. For some of the audience, it was the first opportunity to listen to the candidates.



All candidates running for State House of Representatives 98th District, for State Senate 36th District and for 4th District U.S. House of Representatives were invited. Participating in the Forum were Carl Hamman, Sarah Schulz, Joe Weir, Jerry Hilliard and Ziggy Kozicki. The other candidates were unable to attend.

Questions on women's issues were prepared by the Midland AAUW Public Policy Committee, and questions were also submitted by the audience. These questions were put forth to the candidates and their responses were limited to two minutes for each question. MCTV filmed the event. Reaction to the Forum by the candidates and members of the audience was very positive.

AAUW Opposes Confirmation of Supreme Court Nominee

AAUW advocates members continue to flood the phone lines of their U.S. Senators urging them to oppose the confirmation of Judge Brett Kavanaugh to the U.S. Supreme Court. He supports many actions that are of concern to AAUW.

The nominee, Judge Brett Kavanaugh, has demonstrated hostility to women's right to access abortion; shown little support for workers' rights; failed to support contraceptive healthcare coverage; argued against long-standing precedent prohibiting the use of public funds for religious activities; and has a record of limiting access to the ballot box. If confirmed, Judge Kavanaugh will have a say in women's constitutional and civil rights for decades to come. We cannot support a nominee who will not uphold and protect our fundamental rights.


