Branch will support a new local scholarship, Midland Believes

With the completion of funding an AAUW Fellowship a few years ago, the Midland Board examined current contributions and new opportunities to use Book Sale proceeds. An ad hoc committee recommended the Branch fund a Midland Believes scholarship of \$2,000 for each of the next 2 years. This scholarship, initiated in 2017 and administered by Midland Area Community Foundation, is for high school seniors who would be first generation college students. Both male and female students are eligible. Seven scholarships were awarded the first year; six were renewed for a second year signifying the success of the program.

It was decided the current \$2000 for Graduating Senior Women and Women in Transition scholarships is generous and there is no need to increase the amount awarded. The Board also voted to increase funding to support sending two local women to attend the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders.

Nationally, the AAUW Funds contribution could be designated to support Economic Security for Women, Leadership Initiatives for Women, Education and Training for Women, Governance and Sustainability or where the contribution is most needed. The recommendation is to trust the leadership to use the contribution where most needed to benefit women and girls across the nation in the pursuit for economic equity.

Also - A big thank you to Judi Cox who has accepted the Chairmanship of the Scholarship Committee.
