Equal Pay Lobby Day is Wednesday, May 22, 2019, the anniversary of Michigan's ratification of the federal Equal Rights Amendment in 1972. Registration for the day's events starts at 9:30 am at Central United Methodist Church, 215 N. Capitol Ave, Lansing MI.

Governor Whitmer, state legislators, a representative from U.S. Rep. Elissa Slotkin's office and others will be featured presenters to give updates on state and federal efforts to close the wage gap. Twenty-two bills to strengthen Michigan's equal pay laws will be introduced that day. After a box lunch, we will visit targeted legislative offices to distribute information
