In the past year alone, AAUW has trained more than 102,000 women to negotiate for the salaries they deserve, helped 11 states pass fair-pay laws, and expanded our Empower leadership workshops to Atlanta, Chicago, San Francisco and other cities.

Our branch contribution of \$7,000 was divided between AAUW Greatest Needs Fund--\$6,000 and the AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund--\$1,000. The 2020 AAUW Scholarship Selection Committee consisted of reviewers David Wirth, Terry Townley, and Carol Sarnacke. Judi Cox represented the AAUW Midland Branch during this process. This Committee evaluated 21 Graduating Senior Woman and 14 Woman in Transition applications. Each reviewer used a matrix with points awarded for academic achievements/merit, extracurricular

activities, work experiences, potential benefit to society, family financial need, and application preparation. The review Committee selected 6 candidates from each category which were then forwarded to the Midland Area Community Foundation for final selection.









### Midland Believes Scholarships ~ MACF letter to the Branch

Dear AAUW Midland Branch,

It is my amazing privilege to inform you of the 2020 Midland Believes Scholarship award recipients. This is our fourth year of awarding the Midland Believes Scholarship, and to date, we have impacted 24 students in their journey through post-secondary education. This year, the scholarship program will surpass \$80,000 awarded to low income/first generation college students. This program would not be possible without the generous support of donors like you. Your care and concern help Midland County students for whom the cost of college provides a significant barrier to attendance.

As an indicator that your dollars are well-placed, this spring, a Midland Believes Scholarship recipient from 2017 (Year 1) earned her bachelor's degree in three years. She is now pursuing her master's degree in occupational therapy, which she plans to earn in another year and a half. The funds from the Midland Believes Scholarship were a major factor in her being able to afford to continue toward her advanced degree. And she's not alone in taking advantage of your scholarship dollars. Coming into this year, the program had 12 of 13 award recipients renew their scholarship for a second year.

I look forward to working with these students throughout their college careers to watch what great things they will accomplish. Again, thank you for your kind donation to the Midland Believes Scholarship Program. We couldn't help these wonderful young men and women without you!

### Vote August 4! ~ Jane Wirth, Public Policy

If you are concerned about visiting a polling place, do request an absentee ballot from your city or township clerk. You no longer need some prescribed reason for obtaining an absentee ballot—just ask for one by written, signed request--but don't wait. There will be a dedicated drop box outside city hall where you can deposit your city of Midland ballot by August 4. If you have questions, call the City Clerk's office at 837-3312 or your township clerk.

The League of Women Voters has produced an online guide at **Vote411.org**. It includes all the races on the ballot for this election. Both major political parties may not have candidates for all positions in the general election in November, so this primary could essentially be the election in some cases. BUT there is a dilemma. Since this is a primary, you can make selections among only one party's candidates. There are four millage proposals that are non-partisan.

Exercise your civic responsibility—vote the August 4 primary!
