## Happy 2021 and New Beginnings!

It's traditional to review the past year and visualize/identify new goals for the year(s) ahead. AAUW Midland Branch has many accomplishments to be proud of; soon it will be time to set new goals.



The Midland Branch is proud of a rich heritage of accomplishments since it began in1934. In its early years, members helped establish several community organizations that focused on the arts, education and community service. Many of these organizations now benefit our community, especially women and children.

The Branch continued some early initiatives that have grown significantly. Used book sales now bring in approximately \$17,000 annually with proceeds funding college scholarships for girls and women. These proceeds also allow the Branch to send local college women to an annual national leadership conference and provide financial support for legal advocacy for women at the national level.

Our commitment to education continues with two programs: an annual update of scholarship information, Higher Education Loans Plans and Scholarships (HELPS), used by school counselors and students seeking financial aid to attend college. We also present School Board Candidate Forums in partnership with the League of Women Voters.

Financial security for women is a growing concern for AAUW. The Branch participates in Equal Pay Day events and programs such as Start Smart that promote equal pay for women. At the national level, the Branch supports programs that advance leadership, attempt to end sexual harassment, and ensure economic security and quality of life for women and girls.

### **Going Forward**

AAUW and the Midland Branch continue to evolve to meet the needs of women and girls. The year 2021 may see significant changes in our economy and social structure. This presents an opportunity to review our Branch activities and potential for new ventures.

The Branch Board holds a Planning Session before the beginning of each fiscal year which starts July 1. Branch members will be asked to contribute ideas for revisions and new ventures to be considered for the 2021-22 program year.

In the meantime, visit the AAUW.org website and assess AAUW priorities, listen to webinars presented this past year, and consider how AAUW could help you or your daughter or granddaughter achieve goals and gain equity going forward. There is plenty of work that needs our attention!
