**Census Report and Redistricting.** The just-released census report shows Michigan will be losing a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives. This means that the redistricting of Michigan's congressional districts will be even more important. Stay tuned to the actions of the Michigan redistricting commission which will be making the decision on the boundaries of the reconfigured districts for the first time.
