The Scholarship Selection Committee, in partnership with Midland Area Community Foundation, is pleased to extend scholarships to the following five individuals.

### Graduating Senior Woman Scholarships:

**Sydney Borsenik–** Sydney graduated from Bullock Creek High School with a 4.08 GPA. While attending school she was active in basketball and softball. Sydney plans to attend Saginaw Valley State University in pursuit of elementary education with a specialty in special education for grades K-3. She hopes to "have a classroom that instills empathy and inclusion, where children feel valued and supported".

**Kiana Prany** – Kiana graduated from Midland High School with a 3.84 GPA. Kiana is a first-generation college student. While attending high school she participated in softball, pompon, and band. She plans to attend Michigan Technological University in pursuit of a bachelor's degree in computer science. Kiana aspires to be a part of the trend of "women going into this extremely competitive and challenging STEM field," and looks forward to meeting this challenge.

#### Woman in Transition Scholarship:

**Rebecca Gamble –** Rebecca previously graduated from H.H. Dow High School and Central Michigan University (CMU). She is attending CMU in pursuit of a master's in Physician Assistant (PA) studies. She worked through her initial degree in exercise science and kinesiology with a minor in psychology as a certified nursing assistant (CNA) to gain patient care experience. Rebecca is working toward her PA in a hope to "provide care for those who may not have it in the lower populated regions of Michigan."

**Emily Montgomery –** Emily graduated from Michigan City High School and Alma College. She is intending to attend Central Michigan University to obtain a master's degree in counselor education. ### Technical/Trade School Scholarship:

The 2022 AAUW Scholarship Selection Committee consisted of reviewers David Wirth, Terry Townley, and Mary Graiver. Judi Cox represented the AAUW Midland Branch during this process. This Committee evaluated 21 Graduating Senior Woman, 8 Woman in Transition, and 3 Women in the Trades applications. Each reviewer used a matrix with points awarded for academic achievements/merit, extracurricular activities, work experiences, potential benefit to society, family financial need, and application preparation. The committee selected 2 candidates and 4 alternates from the graduating senior and women in transition applicants, as well as ranked the 3 applicants for the trades scholarship, which were then forwarded to the Midland Area Community Foundation for final selection.
