An Important General Election Is Just Around the Corner Jane Wirth, Public Policy Chair

The General Election is just 2 months away on November 8. With redistricting, many voting sites were moved because the boundaries of precincts changed. I hope you found your voting site for the Primary Election, but you also have the option to cast an absentee ballot in the General Election. Don't wait too long to decide whether you will vote in person or cast an absentee ballot, however. Absentee ballots should be mailed by Monday, October 24, to avoid potential mailing delays or they can be delivered to a drop box outside or inside Midland City Hall by 4 p.m. November 7. If you live outside Midland, check with your township clerk or the clerk in your jurisdiction. Your vote is very important.



Some factors to keep in mind:

- On Thursday, September 15, at 7 p.m., AAUWMI will be sponsoring a statewide Zoom presentation by the 2 ballot issue campaigns that AAUWMI has endorsed. Information to come from AAUWMI.
- The League of Women Voters of the Midland Area will present a program focused on the proposals for amendments to the Michigan constitution expected to be on the November ballot on Monday, September 19 from 7-8 p.m. at Creative 360 in Midland. The public is invited.
- If you have young adults in your family or in your neighborhood who will be 18 before or on November 8, they are eligible to vote, but they must register to vote before October 24.
- Absentee voting starts September 29 and ends November 8.
- College students should check the website <u>Michigan.gov/vote</u> to be sure where they are registered to vote. Ex: Don't get caught in East Lansing when you're registered in Midland. One can request an absentee ballot at the same time on the same site. Questions should be directed to your local clerk.

- Monday, Oct 3: U.S. House of Representatives in the Midland City Council Chambers Candidates: Dan Kildee and Paul Junge
- Tuesday; Oct 4: Midland County Commissioners at MCTV Studio, Grace A Dow Library
- Wednesday, Oct. 5: MI State House: Candidates: Matthew Dawson and Bill G. Schuette: MI State Senate: Candidates: Kristen McDonald Rivet and Annette Glenn.in the Midland City Council Chambers.

There are nine candidates for 3 seats with 4-year terms this year. Date(s) & time(s) are undetermined at this writing, but will be announced in the October TWIG.


Shelterhouse Birthday Project Update ~Barb Galloway
