They are not a city or county agency and they are not the ones that pick up your curbside recycling. Midland Recyclers offers a wide range of services and programs. Many are unique due to their nonprofit status: drop off recyclables from home and business; residential pickup of moving and/or large boxes; shredding confidential documents; educational tours and programs; Upcyclers Shoppe where you can purchase low cost moving and craft supplies, selected electronics items; and the newest program, recycling colored glass.

The Midland Recyclers are reaching out to educate the public about the importance of recycling and striving to inspire people to make a difference individually and in the community. Let's do our part. Bring a friend. Together, we will learn to make that positive impact on the environment in our Midland community.

### Your Vote on November 8 is Very Important

The upcoming mid-term election couldn't be more important for assuring equity and fostering economic security for women and girls in our state. I trust you have a plan for the election—either voting absentee or inperson. The time to make a plan is now!! Take time to learn the philosophies and goals of the candidates. Go to the polls with a list of your choices in hand.

You will be voting for Midland Public School Board Members (3), State Supreme Court Justices, a Midland County Commissioner, a State Representative and a State Senator, a U.S. Representative, and deciding three state constitution amendments among other matters.

The MPS School Board Forum will include 8 of the 9 candidates for 3 positions and will have taken place before you receive The TWIG. However, you can view rebroadcasts of these forums and other League of Women Voters (LWV) forums as follows: Replays and on-demand playback for the school board forum and other LWV forums will be available on Charter Spectrum 191, AT&T U-Verse 99, and streaming devices. **Vote411.com** is the LWV site for reviewing who and what will be on your ballot; a printed voter guide supplement will be published with the Midland Daily News later in the month. The supplement will also be available at local libraries. "AAUW believes everyone has the right to make decisions about their own reproductive lives without government interference. . . . Being able to choose whether and when to become a parent improves women's well-being and fosters economic security—a crucial component of AAUW's mission. This is particularly important in a country that lacks accessible maternal health care, paid caregiving leave and workplace protections for pregnant workers," Gloria L. Blackwell, AAUW Chief Executive Officer declared in June
