### **March General Meeting**

The Midland Public Schools Scenario A Bond Proposal Wednesday, March 12, 2025 6:00 pm – 7:30 pm (doors open at 5:30) Grace A. Dow Memorial Library – Community Room (handicap accessible)

Branch members and their guests are invited to attend the March Annual Meeting on Wednesday, March 12<sup>th</sup> at the GAD Memorial Library (lower level). Our program will focus on the MPS Scenario A Bond Proposal. MPS Board of Education reached a consensus to focus on Scenario A which entails building a seventh elementary school, likely at the north end of the city; building a new Northeast Middle School and demolishing the current one; and moving pre-primary programs out of Carpenter Street School, and into elementary buildings. The bond proposal would also include infrastructure improvements and other needed items for the school district.

Following the program, a soup(s) and salad(s) dinner catered by Panera will be served. The dinner will also include coffee, water, and dessert. The cost is \$20.00 per person. Reservations are required by March 8th. A short business meeting will follow dinner.
